EES & THE DOT

“The Dot,” a children’s book by Peter H. Reynolds, was used to encourage EES students in grades K-5 to overcome obstacles and think positively. The story is about a girl named Vashti who discovers her creativity, shares her talent, and learns to believe in herself. According to Mrs. Lapitsky, EES counselor, the lessons in the book show students how to transform a fixed mind-set into a growth mind-set. “Instead of saying ‘I can’t’, it gently explores what happens when one says, ‘I can try,’” she explains. “You never know what can happen by placing just one dot on a piece of paper,” she added.

Once a week, each grade level meets with Mrs. Lapitsky, and they explore guidance lessons together and tackle the social-emotional side of attending school. Topics include making friends, gaining self-confidence, and learning to become more independent individuals. During these meetings, “The Dot” was used to learn how important it is to accept a challenge and not readily give up.

These guidance issues were further explored this fall throughout the art curriculum. “I love collaborating with other teachers to incorporate classroom lessons into art,” said Mrs. Przybylski, EES art teacher. We started on International Dot Day (yes, there really is such a thing) on September 15, 2020, and every student in the building created their own dot. These dots decorated the hallways, turned into trees, and served as a reminder that everyone is capable of great things. As the quarter continued, so did the art lessons. Soon, students were learning about all kinds of dots through concentric design, cardinal directions, modern artwork, Mexican Oaxaca-style ancient artwork, and even math fractions. “It was such a fun lesson to concentrate on, the students really enjoyed it, and it all began with a single dot,” Mrs. Przybylski concluded.

TRADITIONAL SCHEDULE SET FOR EHS

EHS will be moving to a traditional schedule and eliminating the current block format beginning in August 2021. There have been considerable changes in education and requirements that the block design can no longer optimally support. Over the last two years, the EHS grading scale, course offerings, and class schedule have been examined for areas of improvement. By implementing a traditional schedule, students will benefit from additional course offerings, continuous subject instruction year-to-year, less impact from absences, specially designed instruction (SDI), enrichment and study hall opportunities. The new schedule will include eight, 44 minute periods. More information will be communicated to students, grades 8-11, and their parents in the upcoming months regarding the high school building schedule for next school year.

PUMPKINOLOGY

To celebrate fall, fourth graders turned their math class into a lesson in Pumpkinology. Thanks to donated pumpkins, the students were able to measure the gourds' weights, height, circumference, seeds, and ribs. Students also compared their own body measurements to the pumpkin data. Fun Fact: The largest pumpkin ever grown weighed 2,624 pounds, by a Belgian horticulturist.



THIRD GRADE IS BUSY



In social studies, third graders adorned tortilla shells with gummy bears and frosting to show their knowledge of the seven continents along with where the oceans and equator (licorice) are located.

Stacy Nofzinger from Bracy Gold Bison Farm visited with third graders to talk about bison. Students learned interesting facts and even got to feel a real bison hide.



FIRE SAFETY

Elementary preschoolers and first graders were visited by emergency personnel from the Metamora-Amboy Fire Department to learn about fire safety. While the event did not include hands-on activities as in the past due to COVID precautions, the students received first hand information regarding safety rules, household escape plans, dialing 9-1-1, and the importance of knowing their addresses. Students were also told not to hide or be afraid of firefighters if their house should catch on fire. Firefighters and rescue personnel are helpers and only want to keep children and their families safe, no matter what kind of emergency arises.

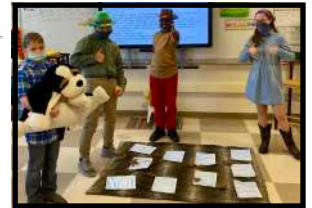

EMS gifted students now have an opportunity to work on their own passion projects. Students are challenged to explore a project that will better themselves or make a positive difference in their school, community, or in the world.

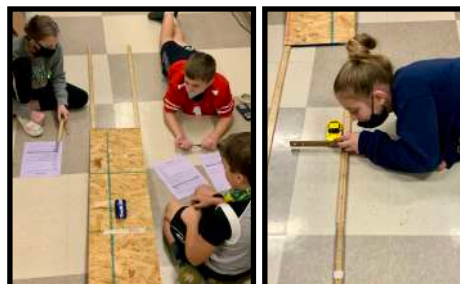

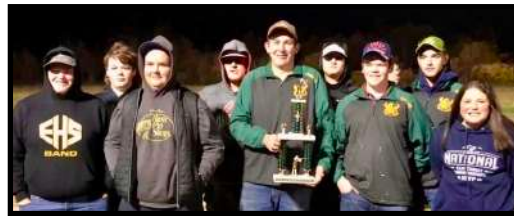
PILLAR OF POSITIVITY

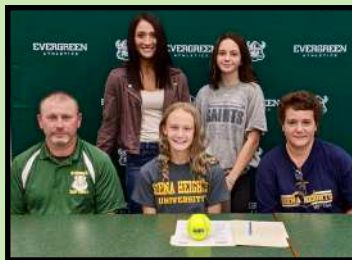
